

Trainer Mini Profiles

Throughout the meet, you will encounter hundreds of trainers, each with his or her own strengths and weaknesses. We have already taken a detailed look at 25 top Gulfstream trainers. Now it is time to analyze 100 other Gulfstream conditioners. Our mini-profiles include a summary stat line with overall record and profitability displayed PLUS the trainer's record on the turf and with 30+ day layoffs (referred to as layoffs). The mini-profiles also include a short text analysis noting the trainer's key strengths and weaknesses. All stats are based on the last three Gulfstream meets. Pay attention to horses mentioned in the mini-profile. Many will come back to win again in '03.

We break the meet down into three cycles. **Hare** mode includes horses making their 1st start of the meet. At Gulfstream, many of these horses will also be making a 1st start off the 30+ day layoff or a career debut (maiden firster). **Mid-meet Monster (MMM)** mode includes horses making a 2nd start of the meet. After that, we move into **Tortoise** mode (3 or more starts at the meet). Almost every mini-profile will classify the trainer into one or more of these categories.

The goal was to select a diverse group of trainers and anticipate trainers (both popular and obscure) who will start horses at the 2003 meet. Included in this group are trainers who are visible but not necessarily successful at the Gulfstream meet. Back in '98, the Calder-based Alonso posted a 4 for 19 record. He then went 3 for 34 at the next three meets. Last year, he broke out with another four-win performance (4 for 39). Hard to say if he can replicate that effort in '03. And it's hard to say in what categories he will strike. The profile shows multiple sprint wins with claimers, four winners returning in 15 to 30 days, and four wins in Tortoise mode. Other than that, Alonso is all over the map. His inconsistency, however, has been offset by some dandy prices. In '99, **Built Up** rocked the tote at 99-1 when breaking maiden after troubled starts in her first two career tries. That same year, **Bay Street Gal (11-1)** scored 2nd start off the 30+ day layoff and **Angela's Tune (20-1)** just missed in a 1st start off the layoff. These latter two runners returned in '02. **Bay Street Gal** returned a much improved lass and captured the One Dreamer on the Florida Derby undercard. **Angela's Tune** scored twice in dirt claimers at 4-1 and 7-1 respectively.

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Pablo Andrade debuted here in '01 with a solid 15-2-3-2 record. He then stepped up his activity in '02 and doubled his output, logging in at 28-4-3-3. At both meets, he was slow out of the gate (1 for 18 in Hare mode) but then picked up the pace in MMM and Tortoise modes. We note multiple winners in three categories: stretching out (2 for 6); making a 2nd start off the layoff (2 for 4); and wheeling back within 14 days (3 for 7). Andrade got a two-bagger from cheap claimer **Raging Bull**, the second bingo coming on a sprint-to-route stretchout. **Tour D'Triomphe (2-1)** was the lone Hare winner, scoring on a 15-day wheelback after a sharp Calder try. Dale Beckner went 2 for 2 for Andrade in '02.
